



Assistant Biologist/ Rivers and Fisheries Officer - Job Description

Argyll Fisheries Trust requires an Assistant Biologist/Project Officer to undertake a range of activities related to the aims of the Trust. The skills and experience of the post holder shall be sufficiently developed to allow independent working with minimal supervision, but where not currently developed, the Trust will assist in attaining the relevant training as needs arise. The Officer is to work in a small team led by the Senior Biologist/Manager to undertake the work of the Trust.

The Officer will be responsible for undertaking workstreams under the direction of the Manager that meet the aims of the Trust. **The Aims of the Trust are:**

- To identify, protect and improve wild fish populations throughout the Argyll region including the islands.
- To understand the composition of all fish populations, distribution and trends in abundance.
- To understand, protect and enhance the physical environment for fish.
- To provide scientifically based advice on fish and fishery Management.
- To educate all sectors of the community on their role in caring for the freshwater environment.

The Officer will be responsible for delivering the aims of the Trust through a range of activities and projects. **The activities of the Officer will include:**

- Undertake sampling of juvenile fish populations by electrofishing to SFCC (and MSS) standards.
- Undertake seine net sampling of sea trout to evaluate sea lice burdens to SFCC standards.
- Operate fixed traps (such as fyke nets and rotary screw traps) to collect samples of fish for fish health and tagging projects.
- Help develop and undertake fish habitat improvement works while supervising contractors and volunteers.
- Help develop and undertake outreach programs and online presence that reflects the work of the Trust.

The Officer will ensure that they develop and maintain sufficient level of skills and experience to be able deliver a high standard of work in a safe and sustainable manner through **training and development:**

- Ensure the Officer is trained (SFCC standard) for sampling of fish by electrofishing, seine netting and trapping.
- Work in a way that reflects the Health and safety policies (and RAMS) of the Trust and any project partners.

The Officer will ensure that the activities of the Trust are accurately **Reported to the Senior Biologist/Manager and project partners:**

- Prepare regular accurate reports on Trust activities to the Senior Biologist/Manager and the Directors of the Trust.
- Deliver public presentations to communicate the work of the Trust.
- Publish regular online reports on Trust activities.

Pay and conditions:

In all areas of the Trust activities, the Officer is required to work as part of a team. A flexible approach will be required to fill in for other members of staff and when required undertake relevant work not included in this job description and to work outside normal working hours (in which case time will be given in lieu). The Officer will be entitled to 25 days paid holiday per annum, a maximum of 14 days of which may be carried over into the next year if not taken in that year.

The Officer will report to the Senior Biologist/ Manager who will manage activities on a day-to-day basis. Where issues arise, the Officer is entitled to contact members of the Trust's Executive Management Committee.

The Officer will be required to undertake activities in a manner that conforms to current legislation on health and safety, equal opportunities and discrimination.

Key Skills

The following is a list of essential or desirable skills for the Fisheries Officer candidate to possess:

- Essential - Computer literate, Inc. familiarity with Microsoft office, including Excel.
- Essential - Capable of generating maps with GIS.
- Essential - Full, clean driving license.
- Desirable - SFCC electrofishing / habitat survey qualification.
- Desirable - Experience with driving while towing a trailer.
